



On 31st January 1961 a group of young men from all corners of Ireland gathered for the first time on a square in the Curragh Camp, and the 35th Cadet Class was born. They would spend eighteen gruelling months working together to become officers in the Irish Army, and after that would be scattered to different postings and even different countries. The 35th Cadet Class would never again exist as an entity, but their time in that class formed life-long bonds of friendship and camaraderie.

Now, sixty years later, they are gathered together again in the pages of this book to tell stories of their lives before, during and after their time in the military.
